Premier Star of the Egyptian Musical Cinema 10/7/29 - 4/12/66

- 1. Birth Name: Na'eema Akef.
- 2. Birthplace: Tanta, Egypt.
- 3. Was born to a circus family and began training at age 4.
- 4. Began her dance career at age 14.
- 5. 1949 First film: Al Eich wal Malh (Bread and Salt).
- 6. Married film producer Hussein Fawzi.
- 7. Worked closely with Mahmoud Reda.
- 8. 1957 Performed in an international youth festival and was nominated best dancer.
- 9. Photograph hangs on the wall of Bolshoi Museum in Moscow.
- 10. 1964 Gave birth to a son.
- 11. At age 37, died of Cancer.

#### Naemet Mokhtar

The Symphony of Belly Dance Circa Early - Late 1900s

- 1. Birth Name: Naemet Mokhtar.
- 2. Birthplace: Alexandria, Egypt.
- 3. Was born to an affluent musical family.
- 4. Was trained to sing by Oum Zaitoun and to dance by Nebaweya Salem.
- 5. 1951 First film: Fataat Al Sirk (Daughter of the Circus).
- 6. Singer, Kareem Mahmoud, discovered her.
- 7. Quote: "I never felt guilty about working as a dancer. People think that success comes easy, but the fact is that I worked hard to be a successful dancer at a time when the field was full of dance stars."
- 8. Married three times.
- 9. Has one son.
- 10. Produced and starred in many films well into the 1970s.

# Tahya Carioca

Queen of Oriental Cabaret Dance 2/22/1919 - 9/20/1999

- 1. Birth Name: Badawiya Mohamed Karim Ali Sayed.
- 2. Birthplace: Manzala, Egypt.
- 3. Was given her last name Karioka from the movie: Flying down to Rio.
- 4. 1935 First film: Dr. Farahat.
- 5. 1942 Most important film: Lu-bat Al-Sit (The Lady's Play).
- 1952 Stopped dancing after the revolusion.
- 7. 1972 One of last films: Kali Belak Min Zuzu (Take Care of Zuzu).
- 8. Was married 14 times.
- 9. No surviving offspring.
- 10. Appeared in over 300 films, plays and television soap operas.

## Nagwa Fouad

The Princess of Cairo 1943 - Present

- 1. Birth Name: Awatef Mommed Al Agamy.
- 2. Birthplace: Alexandria, Egypt.
- 3. Was raised by her stepmother in Jaffa.
- 4. Began performing at Age 15.
- 5. 1960s Debuted in popular stage show: Adwaa Al-Madina (City Lights).
- 6. 1966 Appeared on the cover of <u>Al-</u> <u>Kawakeb</u> Egyptian movie magazine.
- 7. 1976 Qamar Arba'tashar (Moon of the 14th) musical composed especially for her by Mohamed Abd El Wahab.
- 8. Married four times.
- 9. 1970s- Highest paid dancer in the Arab world.
- 10. 1974/75 Performed for Henry Kissinger
- 11. 1978 Performed for Pres. Jimmy Carter.

## Fifi Abdo

The Filly
April 26, 1953 to Present

- 1. Birth Name: Atiyat Abdul Fattah Ibrahim.
- 2. Birthplace: Cairo, Egypt.
- 3. Father was a policeman.
- 4. Is one of 11 children including half-siblings.
- 5. Began her dance career at age 13.
- 6. Never attended school and is self taught.
- 7. 1993-1996 Earned approximately 1.1 million euros.
- 8. Recevied over \$10,000 per performance.
- Owns over 5,000 costumes, several
   Mercedes Benz, and 2 apartments on the Nile.
- 10. Married 5 times.
- 11. 1985 Married for the last time.
- 12. Has 3 daughters; one is adopted.
- 13. 2004 Retired from dancing.
- 14. Is considered to be the best of the "Big Three" which includes Dina and Lucy.

#### Sohair Zaki

The Om Kalsoum of Dance 1944 - Present

- 1. Birth Name: Suhair Zaki.
- 2. Birthplace: Mansoura, Egypt.
- 3. 1953 Moved to Alexandria, Egypt.
- 4. Began performing at 11 years old.
- 5. 1959 Appeared on television.
- 6. 1960s Received awards from Shah of Iran, the Tunisian president, and Gamal Abd El Nasser, the second president of Egypt.
- 7. 1960s Began appearing in film.
- 8. 1970s First to perform to Om Kalsoum songs.
- Often referred to as "Bint el Balad" or "Daughter of the Country".
- 10. Shik, Shak, Shok was written for her by Hasssan abou el Seaoud.
- 11. 2001 Officially retired.
- 12. Married once and has one son.

# Mahmoud Reda & Farida Fahmy The Original Reda Dance Troupe Founded 1959

- 1. Birth Name: The Reda Band.
- 2. Birthplace: Cairo, Egypt.
- 3. Initially made up of 15 dancers.
- Presented over 300 shows.
- 5. Reda & Fahmy were its principal dancers.
- 6. Made four world tours to 58 countries.
- 7. Performed at Carnegie Hall, USA; Albert Hall, UK; Congress Hall, Germany; Stanislavsky & Gorky Theaters, USSR; Olympia, France; and the United Nations, New York and Geneva.
- 8. 1961 Featured in Igazah Nisf as-sinah (Mid Term Vacation).
- 9. 1965 Featured in Gharam fe Al-Karnak (Love in Karnak)
- 10. 1961 Incorporated into the Government.

### Samia Gamal

National Dancer of Egypt 3/5/1924 - 12/1/1994

- 1. Birth Name: Zainab Ibrahim Mahfuz.
- 2. Birthplace: Wana al Qiss, Egypt.
- 3. First film: Min Fat Adimo (He Who Has No Past Has No Future); was a box office flop.
- 4. 1942 First real film: Mamu' al-Hob (Forbidden Love).
- 5. 1949 Began starring with Fareed Al Atrasch, her lover of 8 years.
- 6. 1950 Appeared in LIFE Magazine.
- 7. 1954 Appeared in French Movie Ali Baba et Les 40 Voleurs (Ali Baba & the 40 Thieves).
- 8. 1954 Appeared in Valley of the Kings.
- 9. Was married twice Oil Taycoon, Shepherd King and Egyptian actor, Rushdi Abaza.
- 10. Set the trend for fashion design in her dance career.

## Badia Masabni

Mother of Modern Oriental Dance 1885 - 1970

- 1. Birth Name: Juliette Masabni.
- 2. Birthplace: Halab, Syria, now Lebanon.
- 3. Began her dance career at 17.
- 4. Married famous play actor and singer, Naguib El Righani.
- 1926 Opened Casino Badiya in Cairo.
- 6. Owned three casinos successively.
- 7. Adopted a young girl she named Julliette.
- 8. 1934 Produced first films: Malikat at Masarih (The Queen of the Theaters) and Layali al Qahira (The Nights of Cairo).
- One of the biggest patrons of Badiya's nightclubs was King Farouk.
- 10. Lived out the end of her days in Beirut.
- 11. Is credited for having discovered many of Egypt's Golden Age era belly dancers.
